The following is the text of the Principal's address at our Presentation Evening:

It is a great honour to be giving the principal's address at another presentation assembly for Narara Valley High School. The year has been busy as always but has provided us with so much to celebrate.

It was likewise fantastic for us to celebrate our CAPA concert last night, which was a great success thanks to the excellent student performers, sound and lighting crew and organising students and teachers.

Our merit presentation assembly this morning recognised hundreds who were highly commended for their effort in class. Likewise, tonight's program details significant academic, sporting, artistic and community service achievements from students across all year groups in the school.

Our school continued to make great progress towards achieving the goals of our 2021 to 2025 strategic improvement plan. The key areas of literacy, numeracy, wellbeing, and attendance all had great gains made.

Our progress in literacy and numeracy for Years 7-9 were chiefly measured by the Department of Education's Check In Assessment this year. Narara Valley High School was well ahead of statistically similar schools in Year 7 numeracy, Year 8 Numeracy and Year 9 Numeracy, and higher than state average in Year 8 reading. Literacy and numeracy are key areas of focus in our strategic improvement plan and whilst there is still work to be done, the results above are a great tribute to the hard work of the students and teachers.

Our Year 12 cohort is awaiting their final course results as we speak, however, this is a great opportunity to again acknowledge joint dux recipients Xavier Cardozo and Sunrise Michelle. I would also like to acknowledge Taylah Smith and Sunrise Michelle for nomination for the HSC Dance showcase, Callback. Mimi Gable-Gammelgaard and Ryan Lloyd were nominated for the Shape showcase of HSC Technology major projects. Brandon Kenny and Sunrise Michelle also received nomination for the Music showcase, Encore. This recognition was truly remarkable, and I would like to congratulate the students for their achievements in these courses, under the expert guidance of their teachers.

Alongside our academic achievements, Narara Valley High School students have continued to excel in extracurricular activities. Ms Gilmour led a team of staff and students in a wonderful community service initiative working with the local charity, Coast Shelter. Student engagement in this was exceptional, as was the work of staff supporting them. In the sporting arena, the achievements of George Wells were truly remarkable, culminating in him representing Australia and winning gold at the junior commonwealth games in Trinidad and Tobago. Our most recent extracurricular triumph has been through the achievements of our junior debating team who finished 2nd in NSW out of the 347 teams who competed. This is a magnificent achievement about which you will certainly hear more (tune in to ABC Central Coast 92.5 FM tomorrow morning to hear them in action). These are but a very small selection of the achievements of our students this year. Tonight is about honouring them and so very many more. I want to also honour those students, who may not have received an award today, have worked consistently and been excellent citizens of our school community. There are a great many of you, and you make our school the vibrant and welcoming place that it is, with something for everyone.

Of course, the end of the year brings with it some sadness as some of our wonderful staff team move on to other opportunities. Our long-term Deputy Principal, Mrs Forrest, was successfully appointed Principal of Dubbo High School's Delroy Campus mid-way through this term. We spoke at length last year about her great achievements at our school and will continue to honour these.



Mr Louie, a long-term teacher of TAS and computing, is also leaving Narara Valley High to continue his career at St Edward's College. We thank and acknowledge Mr Louie's years of dedicated service to Narara Valley High School.

Mr Valle, Ms Valle and Mr Sanderson are fantastic Narara Valley Teachers who have secured permanent positions at long last in other schools. We thank them for their time with us and wish them all the best.

Mr Hawke, our skilled and dedicated HSIE teacher, is likewise taking a year off to take up a temporary position at Toormina High School on the mid north coast.

I would also like to acknowledge Ms Rae, our HT English and Relieving Deputy Principal this year, who has successfully secured a temporary promotion for one year. She will take up the position of Deputy Principal at Coffs Harbour Senior College.

Long serving PDHPE teacher, Year Adviser and former student, Mr Heron, will be leaving us to take up an appointment nearer to his home. Mr Heron's contributions to our school have been incredible, highlighted by his service to the HSC class of 2023. We wish him nothing but success.

In our school office, we farewell Ms Ryan and Mrs Burgess. Ms Ryan will take up a permanent position at Kincumber HS following a recent merit selection process. Congratulations, Ms Ryan on this achievement. Mrs Burgess is taking leave to move interstate and be closer to family. We wish her all the very best.

Our General Assistants, Mr Milton and Mr Halls, will begin a well earned retirement following a decades long career working in different areas of the public service. We are very grateful for all that they have done for our school and wish them good health and happiness.

Mrs Hillier is also taking leave in Term 1. We wish her a very safe and happy break and hope to see her back later next year.

Lastly, Mr McAndrew, who has most recently been working with our LINC class, will take up an opportunity at Gorokan HS teaching in the TAS area. We thank him for all that he has done for us and hope to see him back very soon.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the organisers of today's presentation assembly. To Mrs Barrale, our HT Science and Mrs White in our school office, thank you for the months worth of work you have put in to ensure that every detail is considered and that our assembly recognises the broad range of successes in such an authentic way. Thank you also to the team of staff who have assisted them. Thank you to our entire staff team for the outstanding work you do each and every day in supporting or students. Nothing in our school can happen without you and I am truly grateful.

I would like to end by thanking the entire Narara Valley High School community for another successful year. It is clear that as a true community school, with such diverse and wonderful achievements, we have a great deal to celebrate. I am so very proud to lead this school and am extremely excited about what 2024 will bring. I wish everybody a safe and happy Christmas and holiday break. Thank you very much.



ATTENDANCE

At Narara Valley High School we value regular attendance. Thank you to our parents and carers for the support and value that you place on your child being at school and on time each day. Regular school attendance plays a critical role in ensuring that every student has access to the same learning opportunities. Regular school attendance is pivotal for academic achievement and personal success. When students attend every lesson consistently, they are more likely to succeed academically, develop positive relationships with others, and build essential skills. Any student found truanting will receive support from our truancy team and complete processes involved in our whole school attendance initiative. Congratulations to all of the students who received a merit award at our end of year assembly. Students were recognised in front of their peers for their excellent effort throughout the year across a range of subjects.






END OF YEAR DISTINCTION AND SPECIAL AWARD CEREMONY


YEAR 12 PDHPE

Students had been carbohydrate loading as a strategy to get through the workout. They also consumed protein and supplements post workout to assist with muscle repair. Mr Wickert took them to Gee Recovery for muscle repair, relaxation and massage. Students were in ice baths, saunas and compression chairs.

Thank you to Mr Wickert for creating this application lesson for our Year 12 PDHPE class. Students have been able to apply their knowledge and understanding of the Factors Affecting Performance content in context. They can understand and apply concepts such as sets, reps, effort. Students can reflect on physiological strategies that allowed most of them to recovery effectively and walk into school pain free the next day.

Multiple games were played on a hot day at Duffys Oval and Breakers Indoor Sports Stadium against Terrigal High School & Wadalba Community School. Isabelle, Maia & Lilly - Lady Jags - performed amazingly but were unlucky to miss out in the Top 5 due to a small safety deduction.




